Over the course of the summer, PJ Shiels completed the ambitious project of updating the documentation on Woodlawn's collection of Tiffany windows. Over 75 stained glass panels were measured, photographed and assessed for cracks, buckling and the rusting of support bars. This comprehensive study will help us to obtain estimates for repair, connect lot owner descendants with treasured works of art and assist our Security Department in protecting these artifacts. Jack Hopkins will be spending the fall on a landscape restoration project, focusing on the Millhiser Memorial hidden among a group of overgrown shrubs on Central Avenue. Not far from the Woolworth Mausoleum, this site was once a beautiful memorial garden that framed polished pink monuments designed by Tiffany Studios. Our Eagles are making great contributions to our efforts to restore and share memorials made by one of America's greatest artisans.



Fall is right around the corner at Woodlawn - a wonderful time of the year. When the trees in our arboretum start to turn beautiful shades of yellows, oranges, reds and browns, people come to Woodlawn to enjoy the beauty of nature.

WOODLAWN A SILENT CITY OF IMMIGRANTS

Thanks to the generous support of Councilman Andrew Cohen and the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs the Woodlawn Conservancy has produced a new activity book for middle school students. Our research volunteers and programming team explored Woodlawn's "neighborhoods," discovering that sections of the cemetery contain memorials written in German, Italian, Spanish, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Cuneiform and other languages. These monuments tell the stories of pride in heritage and celebrate the accomplishments of scientists like Hideyo Noguchi and Michael Pupin, artists like Attilio Piccirilli and Celia Cruz and freedom fighters such as Julius Langbein and Ambrosio Gonzales. We look forward to sharing these discoveries with the hundreds of students who will be touring our grounds this fall.







We're always excited when people contact us to share information. Not too long ago a box of Steroscope images were discovered, many being the earliest known photographs of Woodlawn. Included in the set was a picture of the Knevals lot on Spring Lake Plot showing a marble carving of a child encased in glass. This is documented as being Woodlawn's first gravestone, a memorial for the son of one of our founding





Trustees. Our Preservation Training Program Summer Interns were so inspired by these old photographs that they dedicated six weeks to documenting and restoring marble headstones in this area.
