


SUMMER CAMP, WHERE??

Hello Friends.





INCOMING INTERNS

Over the course of the next few months, you'll see Interns on the grounds and working from the Jerome Avenue Gatehouse. These High School Juniors and Seniors are helping us to digitize records relating to the care of monuments. In addition they will be photographing memorials as we are working to gather information so it can be accessed through our GIS (Geographic Information System) map and database. These talented young people are associated with the Pathfinders and the CTE (Career Technical Education) Programs.



BRIDGE TO CRAFTS CAREERS LAUNCHES 6TH COHORT

Our very successful partnership with the World Monuments Fund, the International Masonry Institute, and the Door continues as we welcome another class of 18-24 year olds who will train for ten weeks, learning the basics of masonry restoration.

This year our trainees will be working on the Sycamore and Walnut Plots, cleaning marble, power washing mausoleums, and repointing mortar joints. This very successful program is expanding to include a fall session where our young people will learn the basics of landscaping. IN THE BOOKSTORES






Boss of the Grips: Eric Washington's history of the head of the Red Cap Porters takes you back to the Harlem Renaissance and features several Woodlawn personalities.

VICTOR GOINES AND FRIENDS FREE JAZZ CONCERT

JOIN US ON THE LAWN FOR A SPECTACULAR JAZZ CONCERT Sunday, June 20th @ 5 p.m.

This FREE concert performed by Victor Goines and Friends, will mark the premiere of the Woodlawn Suite, commissioned by Woodlawn and composed by musician and jazz great Victor Goines. The Woodlawn Suite will be performed by a 17-piece jazz orchestra,.



Victor Goines will take his inspiration for the new suite from a series of portrait pieces that celebrate the historic tributes to figures of the Harlem Renaissance. These original jazz vignettes, created by Goines, will celebrate the lives of 12 New York characters memorialized at Woodlawn that had an impact on the image and development of New York City.

Clarinetist, saxophonist, and educator Victor Goines is a member of the Jazz At Lincoln Center Orchestra since 1993 and as well as a leader of his quartet. As a leader, Goines has ten recordings to his credit including his latest "A Dance At The Mardi Gras Ball" (2016, Rosemary Joseph Records).
